

# Conclave 2017: Detroit, Michigan "A Family Reunion"





## Gamma Alpha Sigma Chapter 103<sup>rd</sup> Founders Day Celebration & Kickback-Party




103 years of Brotherhood, Scholarship and Service...




Sigma's & Zeta's kicking it for Founder's Day!!!

# The Pilgrimage: Charles I. Brown Celebration in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania



## JANUARY 6 - 7, 2017 FREE ADMISSION TO ALL

I decided to add in the email and information that came in from International Headquarters in regard to the finding of our lost founder, the Honorable Charles I. Brown so that those brothers who may not have internet access or not as likely to use/check their email are aware that this years old Sigma mystery and question FINALLY has an answer and that founder Brown has been properly memorialized into the Omega chapter.

For most living members of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, there has always existed a troublesome piece of our history: what happened to Honorable Founder Charles Ignatius Brown? Our official history notes that Founders Morse and Taylor apparently lost contact with him in 1924, with no one being able to determine his whereabouts or in what place and time did he depart from this life. On the weekend prior to the celebration of our 103rd anniversary, some of those questions have been answered, thanks to the work of our International Historian Bro. Mark Pacich and his team of researchers and archivists. Joined by members of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Philadelphia, the life and work of Honorable Charles I. Brown was celebrated in grand style! Those who attended this event were provided an opportunity to learn about how Founder Brown continued to do the work which he began with his brothers at Howard University, even though he was not actively connected with Phi Beta Sigma in his later years.



On Friday, January 6th, the celebration began with a Welcome Reception hosted by the Planning Committee and local chapters of Phi Beta Sigma at the Sheraton Philadelphia Downtown Hotel. Nearly 1,000 Sigma brothers and friends gathered in large numbers from around the country to discover where and how our missing founder spent his later years.

On that evening, it was revealed that Founder Brown lived to be 96 years old, and spent his final years serving at the St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church in Philadelphia. Members of the parish were unaware of his status as one of the founders of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, until Bro. Pacich and his team pursued leads suggesting that he had migrated to Philadelphia and lived there until his passing in 1981.

These discoveries were made with the assistance of two genealogists, Barbara LaClair and Carole Ashbridge, and Anne Kirkwood, a professional archivist and historian, all of who attended this event. Honorable Brother Daniel J. Tann and Brother Derek Bowmer served as the local chair and co-chair, respectively for the weekend event. Our International President Jonathan Mason best summed up the feelings of many when he stated that "We can now put a period at the end of the sentence which began 93 years ago-our brother, Honorable Founder Charles Ignatius Brown, has been found!" The evening was exciting and emotional, as brothers became aware of the reality that going forward, new members of Phi Beta Sigma would learn a new history, one reflecting the biography of Founder Brown, to which none of us had been privy.

The events of Saturday provided an exclamation point for this celebration. Brothers gathered early to march to the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, to celebrate mass with members of the local Roman Catholic community. Father John Dava provided an inspiring message to the capacity congregation, reminding all that Charles I. Brown indeed carried on the tradition of service to the community which was the hallmark of Phi Beta Sigma's founding, and that this event was equally exciting for the Archdiocese. At the end of the mass, President Mason presented a plaque to the parish where Founder Brown served. From the Cathedral, Philadelphia law enforcement escorted a 10-bus caravan of brothers to Holy Cross Cemetery, the final resting place of Honorable Founder Brown. Amid a significant snowstorm, hundreds of brothers honored our beloved founder by the sharing of the Omega Ceremony. For many, the reality was sinking in. While many will still ask questions about what became of Charles Ignatius Brown after 1924, we can now be at peace with the knowledge that he lived in a community which loved and appreciated his commitment to service just as much as the brotherhood which he helped to create.

## Charles Ignatius Brown Memorial Mass

In a four-year historical research collaboration between St John's and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, we have proven that Charles Ignatius Brown, our former St. John's staff member (1965-1981), was a long-lost founder of this prestigious college fraternity, founded at Howard University in 1914. Charles was born to a devout Catholic family in Washington DC, orphaned at a young age, and raised by St. Katherine Drexel and her Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament in Bensalem in the 1890s. Many years after college, he returned to Philadelphia and spent his last years working at St. John's and cared for by our priests in old age. Please join us in congratulating the fraternity on this momentous historical discovery at a 9:00am Memorial Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul on Saturday, January 7, 2017. At 11:30am, after the Mass, a monument will be dedicated in a ceremony at St. John's parish plot, where Charles is buried, at Holy Cross cemetery in Yeadon. Later that day, at 12:30pm, a plaque in Charles' honor will be unveiled here at St. John's. Join us for these festive events marking a unique chapter in the history of St. John the Evangelist parish and church.







# Gamma Alpha Sigma Educational Foundation "Building a Bridge through Education" Scholarship



We want the brothers of the chapter to know that some great news is coming down the pike from the 501c3 arm of the chapter. The Gamma Alpha Sigma Education Foundation has been in full swing taking applications for its "Building a Bridge through Education" Scholarship. The scholarship will award selected African American male candidates with financial assistance to be used for tuition, books and/or fees at an accredited 2 or 4-year institution of higher learning for the 2017 school year.

Applications will be reviewed for academic achievement, leadership and community service to determine eligibility and ultimately award. As a final push to promote the scholarship, if any brother knows of someone who can possibly benefit from the scholarship, it is important that all application materials are completed in its entirety and must be legible. Additionally, all requested materials must be received by the scholarship committee no later than Friday, March 17, 2017 (**NO EXCEPTIONS**). Any application received that is not complete, legible and/or is not received by the aforementioned guidelines will be automatically excluded from consideration.

In order for candidates to be eligible, all applicants for the "Building a Bridge through Education" Scholarship must:

- Complete and submit application in its entirety by Friday, March 17, 2017
- Be an African American Male graduating high school in 2016-2017 school year
- Have a grade point average of 2.5 and above (on 4.0 scale)
- Be accepted as a full time student at a 2 or 4-year college for the 2017 academic year
- Include 2 letters of recommendations (non-family and at least 1 academic)
- Official transcripts from Registrars' Office
- Applicants must be a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States
- Must attend school in Cuyahoga or surrounding counties
- Complete 300 word typed essay answering the question "How will you use education to build a bridge to help the African American Community?"

We are proud and excited to know that through our efforts we will be able to help deserving young African American males achieve their goals and dreams through post-secondary education. If anyone has any other questions about the Building a Bridge through Education Scholarship or for the Gamma Alpha Sigma Education Foundation in general, please contact Bro. Ed Long. # Christmas Holiday Service Project @ University Settlement






